It aims to engage with 100 students from disadvantaged areas (Logan, Caboolture and Ipswich) and offer a Swimming and Water Safety Teacher Skill Set which will provide them the required accredited training to become a Learn to Swim Instructor. A dedicated project co-ordinator will be employed to facilitate partnerships between schools and industry, provide career pathway information to students, and work closely with the nominated Registered Training Organisation, AUSTSWIM, to ensure students obtain a successful training outcome.
Aussie Painters Network	Painting Your Career project	Construction	Salisbury	The project aims to assist 108 high school students from high youth unemployment areas such as the Logan and Ipswich regions. Participants will receive industry-relevant training, employability skills education, and individualised support which will assist their transition from school to the workforce. Moreover, 21 students will have the opportunity to engage in Work Experience opportunities and 10 students to explore School-based Apprenticeship and Traineeship options. The project will provide pathways into the construction industry, with anticipated outcomes including connection to job opportunities and apprenticeship-level skills, aiming for all participating students to achieve positive outcomes.

Through mentorship, cultural learning, practical construction experience, and accredited training opportunities, the project provides career pathway exploration and individualised support to enhance participants' skills and knowledge for employment in the construction industry.

It seeks to motivate students, improve their employability skills, and increase understanding of relevant employment and training options. This will be done through quality information and advice provided and access to relevant industry experiences. Project activities include employability skills academy workshops, local industry mixer events, and facilitating work experience opportunities for 75 students and School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships for 25 students.

The project will engage with 100 students and introduce them to high priority industries within the Gympie region namely; Manufacturing, Construction, Agriculture, and Health and Community Services. Out of 100 students to be assisted, 30 students will participate in Work Experience and another 30 students will be involved in School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SAT). The project will provide the students with career information sessions, work experience and industry immersion opportunities.
