Congratulations to our 2024 regional finalists

Across our seven regions and 11 regional award categories, the 2024 Queensland Training Awards have selected 223 exceptional regional finalists.

Thank you to the hundreds of people who submitted or supported a nomination, along with all the judges who lent their time and expertise this year.

The process to shortlist and interview nominees to find our regional finalists is a major undertaking and it is great to have past winners and representatives from industry and training stakeholders, along with departmental staff, coming together to identify our state's best apprentices, trainees, students, teachers or trainers, community training initiatives and employers.

Among this year's judges were some recent winners. Gabrielle Clift, the 2023 Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year, stepped in for her first year of judging and 2022 Bob Marshman Trainee of the Year, Tony Karamatic, was back for his second time.

Gabrielle said judging and conducting interviews with shortlisted finalists had been exciting but also a different experience compared to when she was a nominee last year.

"It can be nerve-wracking competing with Queensland's best apprentices, however judging them is another extreme. Each and every applicant is deserving in their own right," she said.

"There are so many people making a difference within their communities, workplaces and industries. I feel privileged to hear their stories."

Tony was excited to be a judge again this year and still remembers his own experience answering their questions two years ago.

"I enjoy hearing the inspiring stories of the people who have nominated this year," he said.

"Every year there is an amazing story that I love to listen to, and I want to be part of something that will inspire or reward these people."


