Congratulations to the 2021 Queensland Training Awards state winners and finalists celebrated during Friday night's special <u>State Final Diamond Jubilee</u> virtual event — marking 60 years of the awards.

Hosted by television personality Sofie Formica, the virtual celebration was viewed from different devices and screens in homes and venues right across the state, with the achievements of 85 finalists and winners celebrated across 14 award categories.
