What is IWSDG?

The Indigenous Workforce and Skills Development Grant (IWSDG) program funds Indigenous designed and led projects that support or respond to local training and workforce needs.

The program aims to create training and employment pathways for up to 800 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples over two years to increase their likelihood of greater economic and social participation.

What's on offer?

The IWSDG program funds Indigenous organisations to deliver place-based projects that have a focus on assisting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people into employment.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples may also be indirectly assisted with local Indigenous and non-Indigenous employers being supported to create culturally safe and responsive workplaces.

Funded projects may include a mix of the following services and activities:

- Soft or essential skills so you can thrive in any workplace
- Mentoring and career coaching
- Accredited training can be a skill set or a full vocational qualification
- Career advice, resume writing, job search techniques and job readiness skills
- Foundations skills language, literacy, numeracy, digital and employability skills
- Wrap around support and individualised case management to build your confidence
- Health and well-being support
- Work experience opportunities
- Culturally customised business training to build business skills and support self-employment or starting a small business
- Help to get identification documents such as birth certificates, Medicare cards, tax file numbers etc

Who is eligible?

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who are:

- Living in Queensland
- 15 years or older and no longer enrolled in school

You can be a job seeker or be working and need support to stay in your job or you would like to change jobs.

The selection of participants is at the discretion of the funded Indigenous organisation.

What does it cost?

No cost – it's free for participants.
