



Government funded VET participation

Provider type

- A total of 224,222 Queensland students participated in government funded vocational education and training (VET) during 2022-23.
- Of all government funded students in Queensland in 2022-23, 44.0 per cent studied at a TAFE and other government provider and 58.1 per cent studied at a non-government provider.

Notes:

- a. Data is for government funded VET students only, which includes all students funded by government. School providers are excluded from government-funded reporting.
- b. All Queensland TAFE institutes, Central Queensland University, University of Queensland Skills, Queensland Agricultural College and Queensland College of Wine Tourism are classified as 'TAFE and other government providers'. All other providers are classified as 'Non-Government Providers'. Schools are excluded from government-funded reporting.
- c. A student is only counted if the student had at least one competency outcome (successful or otherwise) in the reporting period.
- d. Summing the students for each provider type may not equal the total. This is because individual students may study at government and non-government providers.
