It reaches across industries and recognises employers and training providers of all sizes, community training initiatives pursuing local priorities, industry partnerships reaching for big goals, and apprentices, trainees, students and teachers or trainers from different fields and levels of study.

The process of gathering nominations, judging and selecting finalists and organising events worthy of their stories is a big project that relies on the support and dedication of our sponsors, suppliers and stakeholders. The opportunity to be part of this year's program will demonstrate your organisation's commitment to recognising positive vocational education and training stories and this vital sector's achievements and future development.

Background

Since 1962, the Queensland Training Awards have been celebrating success, best practice and innovation in vocational education and training (VET).

The awards are a valuable platform to positively position and promote VET pathways in Queensland and nationally, with alignment to the Australian Training Awards.

Across the state, hundreds of nominations are submitted each year across many categories covering:

- apprentices and trainees
- school-based apprentices and trainees
- graduates of certificate, diploma and advanced diploma courses
- employers who use training in their workplace
- training organisations, teachers and trainers
- community-based organisations.

Among these nominees will be a mix of people and organisations whose first real taste of the Queensland Training Awards is attending one of the seven regional finals:

- Tropical North Queensland
- North Queensland
- Central Queensland
- North Coast
- Metropolitan
- Darling Downs South West
- South East.

They are a valuable opportunity to bring together and celebrate the people and businesses, in front of their supporters and key stakeholders, that are making positive contributions to the local workforce and economy.

All the regional winners, along with the finalists for the large and small training provider and industry collaboration categories, will then head to the Queensland Training Awards state gala event in September. They will be joined by key representatives from government, industry groups, VET stakeholders Eleven of these regional winners will hear their names called as state winners.

State winners from aligned categories also have the opportunity to represent Queensland, competing with other states and territories to be named the nation's best at the Australian Training Awards in November.

2024 outcomes

With 749 nominations submitted in 2024, the awards continue towards returning to pre-pandemic levels of engagement. This led to seven successful regional finals held across the state, with over 1800 attendees coming together to celebrate their region's best and brightest in training.

Key outcomes for 2024 included:

- Sponsor involvement at sponsored events, attended by finalists, friends and family, as well as industry, VET sector and government representatives across regions.
- Sponsor pages for each regional final listed names, logos and links for each sponsor.
- An extensive social media program, including nomination promotions, finalist and winner content and sponsor acknowledgements across <u>Skills for Queensland</u> and <u>Business Queensland</u> Meta (Facebook) pages, and <u>DTET LinkedIn</u>. This activity delivered strong performance and engagement across social channels with a total reach of more than 826,000 people (166% increase on 2023) and 1.75 million impressions (310% increase on 2023).
- Regular distribution of targeted regional and statewide emails including QTA News (distributed to
 more than 3100 active subscribers), plus promotion in other departmental newsletters, such as
 Business Queensland Connect, which is distributed to more than 50,000 subscribers, the new
 Queensland Jobs and Skills Connect and Contract Connector, which is sent to around 1100 Skills
 Assure suppliers (training providers) and other stakeholders.
- Media coverage reaching a potential audience of more than 850,000 people with a total advertising space rate of \$90,270.
- Sponsors were recognised in the regional event programs and thanked from the stage by the Master of Ceremonies.

In addition to reaching audiences through the above channels, sponsors gain additional brand exposure through the benefits offered under their chosen sponsorship package.

Award categories

There are 14 categories at the Queensland Training Awards open for sponsorship.

Your organisation may choose to sponsor one or several categories, or select another sponsorship type (detailed in regional sponsorship packages over the page).

Individual categories

Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year for outstanding achievement by a student who recently completed an apprenticeship in Queensland.

Bob Marshman Trainee of the Year — for outstanding achievement by a student who recently completed a traineeship in Queensland.

Vocational Student of the Year — for outstanding achievement by a student who recently completed a VET qualification.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year — for outstanding achievement by an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student within the Queensland VET sector.

School-based Apprentice or Trainee of the Year— for outstanding achievement by a student undertaking a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship.

Equity Student of the Year — for outstanding achievement by an individual in overcoming a significant barrier or disadvantage to effectively participate in VET.

VET Teacher or Trainer of the Year — for outstanding achievement by a teacher or trainer providing nationally recognised training to students at a registered training organisation, or in partnership with a registered training organisation.

Organisation categories

Small Employer of the Year — for outstanding achievement in the area of VET by a Queensland business or enterprise with 19 or fewer full-time equivalent employees. *Category will go through another judging process to decide if progressing to Nationals.

Medium Employer of the Year — for outstanding achievement in the area of VET by a Queensland business with 20 to 199 fulltime equivalent employees. *Category will go through another judging process to decide if progressing to Nationals.

Large Employer of the Year — for outstanding achievement in the area of VET by a Queensland business or enterprise with 200 or more full-time equivalent employees.

Community Training Initiative of the Year for providing outstanding assistance to Queenslanders to gain the skills, experience and VET qualifications required to enter and stay in the workplace, by a community-based not-for-profit organisation.

State level only categories

Small Training Provider of the Year — for outstanding contribution to the delivery of VET in Queensland by a registered training organisation with fewer than 500 students enrolled at the time of nominating.

Large Training Provider of the Year — for outstanding contribution to the delivery of VET in Queensland by a registered training organisation with 500 or more students enrolled at the time of nominating.

Premier's Industry Collaboration Award — for an outstanding collaboration providing exemplary skills development between an employer or industry body and at least one training provider.
