



Training sparks Craig's future

"Winning a Queensland Training Award was a huge reward for the effort put into my apprenticeship; it really did confirm that that I'd taken a good path," says 2009 Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year Craig Folker.

"I truly believe my training gave me the best real-life pathway to transition from school life into full-time employment," he said.

More than a decade on since completing his electrical apprenticeship, Craig is now the Electrical and Electronics Manager at Riviera Australia on the Gold Coast, and features in a new video celebrating the Queensland Training Awards' Diamond Jubilee and the power of skills to transform lives.
