

## Free short courses to help jobseekers

Developed in partnership with TAFE Queensland, six new Back to Work courses will help jobseekers and employees to enter, re-enter and stay in the workforce.

The first three are ready for enrolment:

- **Job search techniques (modern)** – developing skills to successfully search for jobs using current methods and platforms. The micro-credential provides information on navigating online job boards, targeted searches and application material.
- **Becoming an employee** - starting work in Queensland, including rights and responsibilities, tax and budgeting tips, fit for work requirements and understanding workplace ethics and professionalism.
- **Building a digital and online profile** - covers the fundamentals of a professional online profile with tips on creating an engaging profile, managing your online profile and how to build your network.

Back to Work courses are free, online, and designed to be completed over two hours or at the student's own pace.

## Building Queensland's skilled workforce

With over 40,000 apprentices and trainees starting in 2024, the Queensland Government is encouraging more people to explore apprenticeships.

Major employer Hastings Deering is one business investing in Queensland's future, recently welcoming approximately 50 new apprentices to its team (*pictured above*). These apprentices will undertake qualifications in areas such as Certificate III Engineering, Certificate III Electrotechnology Electrician, and Certificate III Mobile Plant Technology, gaining practical skills while working across nine locations, including the Far North, Central Queensland, and South-East Queensland.

A range of existing support is available to employers who take on apprentices, including payroll tax rebates, premium discounts from WorkCover Queensland and the Back to Work program, where employers recruit eligible unemployed jobseekers.

Now is the perfect time for employers to take-on apprentices, sharing their hard-earned knowledge and helping train the next generation of high-skilled tradespeople.

Focusing on the need to 'Accelerate Action' emphasises the importance of taking swift and decisive steps to address the systemic and cultural barriers that women face.


