# Supporting regional jobs and strengthening the sugar industry

Mackay Canegrowers, working with regional canegrowers organisations and local industry leaders, successfully delivered a targeted haul-out training course in Tully to help address the sugar industry's driver shortage.

With funding from the Skilling Queenslanders for Work *Community Work Skills* program, 10 local participants, including people with disability and mature-aged job seekers, gained accredited training and hands-on experience operating essential sugarcane transport machinery.

All 10 gained full-time employment post-training, helping build a skilled and sustainable workforce for Far North Queensland's sugar sector.

<u>Participation Fund</u>, the <u>Torres Strait Kaziw Meta's</u> *Remote Indigenous Boarding Students Mentoring and*<u>Employment support</u> program is successfully delivering meaningful guidance and support to young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in the Torres Strait.

Respected local Torres Strait Islander and Career Transition Officer, Jimmy O'Cloudy, said "This program is more than just about jobs; it's about instilling



confidence, building skills and fostering a sense of purpose among our youth. Watching students step into roles that not only provide financial independence but also contribute to their communities has been incredibly rewarding".

Significantly surpassing its targets, the program has engaged 50 participants in activities to either prepare for work with practical skills or gain employment.
