Support to develop skills

Subsidised training

Subsidised training is where the Queensland Government makes a contribution to the cost of your course. This reduces the cost of study for a wide range of vocational education and training courses offered by training providers.

There are several subsidised training programs including:

- **Certificate 3 Guarantee** helps you complete first post-school certificate III qualification.
- **Higher Level Skills** helps you complete first post-school certificate III qualification.
- Trade Skills Assessment and Gap Training If you
 have experience and are eligible, you can upskill
 in priority trade areas by having your current skills
 recognised, as well as complete gap training to
 assist you in obtaining a trade qualification.

Apprenticeships and traineeships

Combine training and a job through an apprenticeship or traineeship. Whether in a traditional trade or an emerging industry, they are a great way to gain practical work experience while working towards a qualification.

The Queensland Government provides funding to cover the cost of training associated with your apprenticeship or traineeship.



Study 160 tafe courses in high priority areas and kick-start your career by getting the skills employers want without the fees.

Support for jobseekers

Back to Work Jobseeker Officers

We work with jobseekers, or those at risk of losing their jobs, to provide career advice and identify training opportunities to help find a job.

Skilling Queenslanders for Work

If you are a jobseeker this initiative will help you gain the skills, qualifications and experience to enter and stay in the workforce.

Skilling Queenslanders for Work funds community-based projects that offer support ranging from basic foundation and life skills through to earning new qualifications as well as traineeships offering hands on experience. It also provides incentives for employers who recruit Skilling Queenslanders for Work participants.
